

Arthur Light, MD Lectureship in Ophthalmology



John J. Skowron Distinguished Professorship in Ophthalmology

The late John J. Skowron, MD, was a graduate of the Stritch School of Medicine Class of 1943. His 40year career in ophthalmology included a special interest in cataract surgery and glaucoma and a keen interest in educating ophthalmology residents. Through his generosity, twice each year we present a prominent subspecialist in ophthalmology to discuss a current topic in that field.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Glaucoma management techniques are complex and include medication, laser and surgical techniques. Design changes in intraocular lenses and surgical techniques for treating cataracts are rapid and constant. The comprehensive ophthalmologist is challenged to remain current in his/her understanding of and proficiency with the myriad treatment modalities. This program will address the newest information, designs and techniques in these areas.
